In The News

INDIAN RIVER COUNTY — The county is spending money to buy property that could become a future water storage and treatment site.

Commissioners unanimously approved spending \$1 million to buy an 83.14-acre property at 925 5th St., SW, contingent on an inspection of the site. The property could be used for surface water storage because it is adjacent to the 6-month-old Osprey Marsh project, which removes pollutants such as nitrogen and phosphorous from canal water before sending it into the Indian River Lagoon. Long-term water stored on the site could eventually be used as a source for drinking water, Utilities Director Vincent Burke said in a memorandum to County Administrator Joe Baird about the property.

There are some concerns about the property, including the proximity to residential homes, Burke said. The property also is limited in size, without expansion possibilities, Burke said.

The county originally offered \$914,540 before upping the price to \$1 million. The property has been vacant since the 1960s, but has changed ownership several times over the years, Burke said. A 190-home development, Blackstone Preserve, initially was planned early this year. But the developer opted against buying the property, he said.

County staff hopes to inspect the site by February, with a potential March 1 closing. Money for the property would come from the capital budget, Burke said.

"It's well worth moving forward and taking a deeper look at it," Commissioner Peter O'Bryan said.
