- K-12 Engineer Volunteer of the Year recognizes the FES member who has volunteered his or her time to introduce engineering and technology concepts and activities to K-12 students. Who May be Nominated:
 - 1. Any current FES member who has actively promoted engineering and technology concepts to K-12 students.
 - 2. FES Member must be nominated by a local chapter of the Florida Engineering Society.
- K-12 Teacher of the Year for Engineering recognizes a K-12 teacher who creatively incorporates or promotes engineering and technology concepts and activities in his or her lessons in the classroom. Who May be Nominated:
 - 1. Any full time K-12 classroom teacher currently certified and teaching in the state of Florida.
 - 2. Teacher must be nominated by a local chapter of the Florida Engineering Society.


Each of these awards includes a monetary prize to be presented to the teacher, school, volunteer, and chapter. 
