MathCounts Student Problem of the Month



Alyssa, Benson, Carlos and Diana go to the park. They sit down at the two opposite, long sides of a picnic table. Each side of the table can accommodate two individuals. A tree shades one-half of the table and half of the seats from the sun, while the other half of the table and seats are not shaded, as shown. Carlos has sensitive skin and must sit in a seat located on the shaded half of the table. Diana and Alyssa are enemies and insist on sitting at opposite sides of the table. How many different arrangements are there for the four of them to be seated at the two opposite, long sides of the table?



Suppose two tables are pushed together, and now there are two seats on each of the four sides of the newly constructed picnic table, as shown. The tree continues to shade one-half of the table and half of the seats from the sun, while the other half of the table and seats are not shaded. Alyssa, Benson, Carlos and Diana again sit down at the table. Again, Carlos must sit at a shaded seat due to his sensitive skin. Diana and Alyssa still insist on sitting at opposite sides of the table. How many different arrangements are there for the four of them to be seated at the table now?



Erin joins them at the park 10 minutes later. The eight seats are positioned around the table as in the last problem and the same seating restrictions apply for Carlos, Alyssa and Diana. Suppose Erin decides to sit in a seat located on the half of the table that is shaded. How many ways are there for the five of them to be seated at the table?
